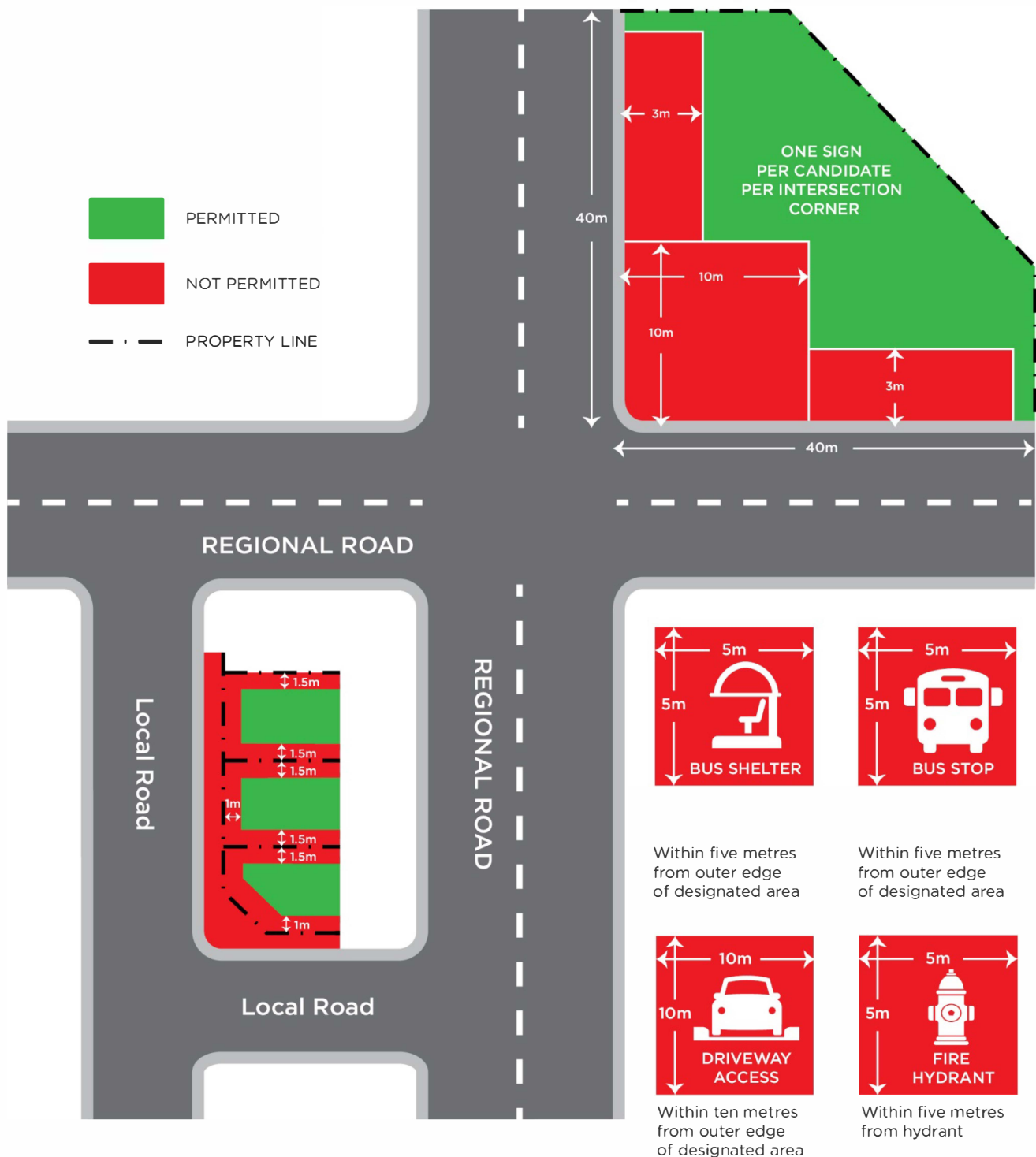


City of Vaughan Election Sign Restrictions

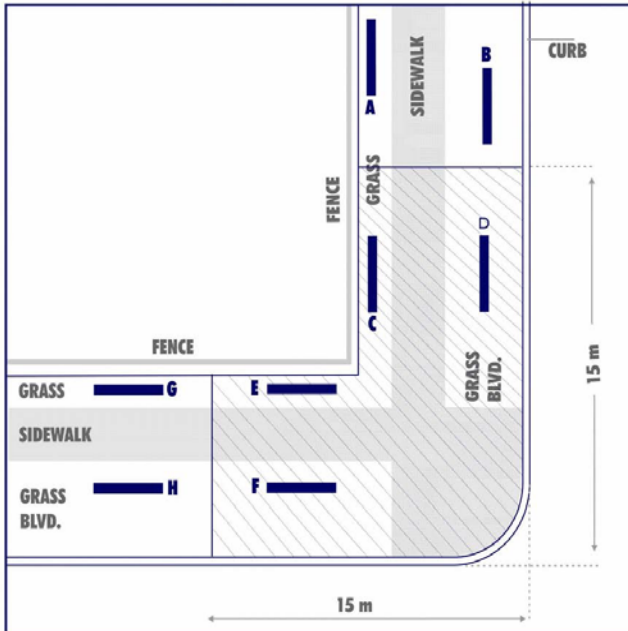
- Election signs cannot exceed a maximum sign area of 1.49 square metres.
- Signs must be set back a minimum of one metre from all street lines and can be erected starting Sept. 10, 2018, six weeks prior to Voting Day
- Signs must be set back a minimum of 1.5 metres from any common lot boundary with an adjacent lot
- Signs cannot be located within a day-lighting triangle
- Signs must be located on private property and no person shall cause or permit the erection of election sign on municipal property under the jurisdiction of the City of Vaughan
- No person shall cause or permit the erection of election signs on all public road allowances
- Within the regional road allowances, including at the intersection of regional and local roads, the regional rules prevail



City of Toronto

A candidate or third party advertiser wishing to post election signs should be aware of the City of Toronto rules outlining what is permissible. Their website provides information and links about the Municipal Code, deposit form, waiver, enforcement and set fines.

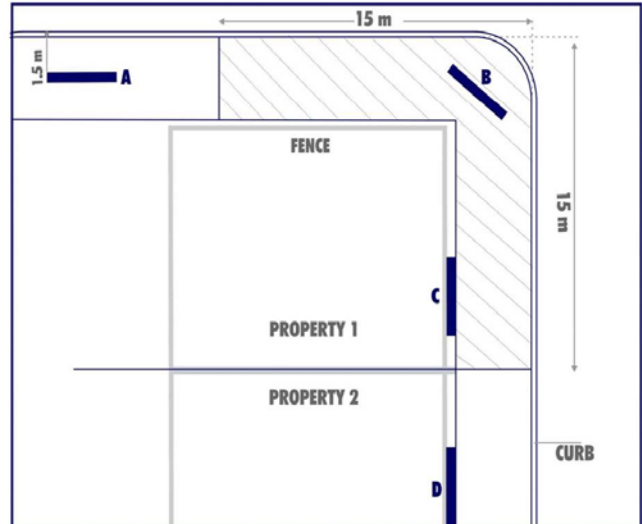
Signs A and G
Permitted, not within 15m of intersection and not between sidewalk and curb

Signs B and H
Not permitted to be placed between sidewalk and curb

Signs C, D, E, and F
Not permitted as the signs are within 15m of an intersection

No Intersection Zone

A PICTORIAL EXPLANATION - SKETCH B



Sign A
Permitted provided sign is placed 1.5 m back from the outside of the curb

Sign B
Not permitted as the sign is within 15m of an intersection

Sign C
Signs attached to fence are permitted as being located on private (no deposit required) however, if the sign obstructs the vision of pedestrians or vehicles rounding the bend it is considered a hazard and shall be removed

Signs C and D
On private property or fence (no deposit required), however, if sign installed without permission from land owners of Property 1 and Property 2 the signs will be removed at the request of the owners

ELECTION SIGN REFERENCE CARD

Registration

A non-refundable Election Sign Permit fee may be applied per candidate per local municipality in which candidates or third party advertisers seek to install signs.

Sign Size

Signs must be in proper repair and not exceed 1.22 metres (4 feet) high and 1.22 metres (4 feet) wide.

Sign Placement

Reference back for a sign restriction diagram

- Signs are only permitted at intersections on Regional roads
- No candidate, registered third party or registered third party advertiser shall place more than two signs per intersection (one per corner) at permitted Regional intersections

It is encouraged that anyone installing signs have appropriate insurance to protect themselves and cover any costs related to potential damage to utilities, infrastructure or other incidents resulting from the installation of a sign. It is the sign installer's responsibility to obtain any necessary utility clearances from Ontario One-Call.
