Civil Marriage Ceremony Information Package



City of Vaughan Marriage Services

Couples wishing to be wed at Vaughan City Hall may apply for marriage services through the Office of the City Clerk. Due to the civil nature of the service, there cannot be any religious connotation to the ceremony.

Location

The City Hall Garden Room is available to host civil marriages. The maximum capacity of this room is 49 people (couple + officiant + 2 witnesses + 44 guests).



Date and Time

Ceremonies are available between the hours of 9:00 a.m. and 3:00 p.m., Monday through Friday, except statutory holidays. A surcharge of \$100.00 + HST will apply to ceremonies performed outside regular business hours. The ceremony room is provided for a maximum of one hour.

Reservation

You may book a civil ceremony up to 3 months in advance. Please provide a minimum of 2 weeks' notice. To schedule a ceremony, you may contact the Office of the City Clerk:

Once the Office of the City Clerk has assigned an officiant to your ceremony, you will be contacted to schedule a mandatory pre-ceremony consultation.

Fees

- Civil Marriage Ceremony \$450.00 + \$58.50 (HST) = \$508.50
- After-Hours/Off-site Ceremony \$555.00 + \$72.15 (HST) = \$627.15 (Applicable fees and taxes are subject to change without notice)



Cancellation and Rescheduling

Prior to your consultation, you may cancel or reschedule your ceremony without penalty. While reschedules are permitted without penalty after the consultation, availability with the same officiant may be limited. If a ceremony is cancelled after the consultation, a refund minus \$150 + HST administrative fee will be issued. Please allow 2 to 3 weeks for processing.

Witnesses

You are required to bring two (2) witnesses to be present during the ceremony. Witnesses must be at least eighteen (18) years of age. They should be able to understand and appreciate the ceremony which is taking place and be able to give evidence of such at a later date, if required.

Interpreter

If an applicant does not speak English or requires language assistance, the couple is responsible for providing an interpreter. The interpreter should not be one of the witnesses. The interpreter will be required to sign a form confirming that he/she has interpreted the wedding ceremony.

Consultation with the Officiant

You will be required to attend a consultation with the marriage officiant, to be scheduled by appointment for at least three (3) business days prior to the day of the ceremony.

- The ceremony fee shall be paid in full at the time of the consultation. Acceptable methods of payment are cheque, debit, Visa and Mastercard.
- Both applicants must be present and provide one piece of current, valid, government-issued photo identification, e.g. Driver's Licence, Passport, Permanent Resident card
- A valid Ontario Marriage Licence must be presented to the Officiant at the consultation. Marriage Licences may be purchased from any Ontario municipality and are valid for three (3) months from the date of issue.
- A Civil Marriage Ceremony Questionnaire must be completed and submitted to the Officiant at the time of the consultation.
- Please provide written copies of any additional vows.

Ceremony Policies and Guidelines

- 1. To maintain the dignity of the marriage ceremony, clothing should be appropriate for the occasion.
- 2. Alcohol or stimulants are not to be used by the applicants or their witnesses prior to or during the Marriage Ceremony. The Officiant may cancel the ceremony if this rule is violated.
- 3. No decorations, confetti, bubbles, candles, live animals (not including service animals) or incense are allowed in or on the grounds of the City Hall. Bouquets of flowers are accepted inside the ceremony room.
- 4. No music will be provided by the City during the ceremony, and no speaker system is installed in the ceremony room.



- 5. The determination as to whether photographs will be taken during the ceremony should be made during the consultation.
- 6. The City does not provide private dressing facilities for the bridal party.
- 7. Applicants shall be responsible for the conduct of all persons attending a ceremony at City Hall.
