## A MESSAGE FROM THE MAYOR

## The Black Creek Renewal Project is underway!



The City of Vaughan broke ground on the Black Creek Renewal Project, a \$224-million initiative strengthening flood protection, restoring the natural environment and revitalizing the Vaughan Metropolitan Centre.

The start of construction was celebrated in November 2025, with Mayor Steven Del Duca, Members of Council and provincial and federal partners. Phase 1, currently underway, includes the construction of Edgeley Pond and Park. The project is anticipated to be completed in 2031, following phased delivery of infrastructure improvements.

In January, Mayor Steven Del Duca, Members of Council, the Treasure Hill Homes team and members of the Vaughan Soccer Club held an event to officially open the soccer dome and welcome the community into the new facility for the first time.

Located at 11085 Keele St. within NMRP, the soccer dome features an 11 versus 11 artificial turf field and supports year-round indoor

programming, providing athletes consistent access to high-quality training and play regardless of the weather.

This new first-of-its-kind facility at NMRP supports the City's long-term vision to create a nationally significant park that focuses on restoring nature, sharing culture, promoting active living and building community.


## Welcoming 16 new firefighters

Work began in early fall 2025 and included slope stabilization, a culvert replacement and full road reconstruction.

Get ready to walk, bike or roll along Islington Avenue! Active transportation upgrades, including a new multi-use pathway from Highway 7 to Kilaran Avenue, and repaved multi-use pathway from Langstaff Road to Major Mackenzie Drive. Construction was completed in November 2025.

## Vaughan's Santafest Parade



## 2026 BUDGET A BUDGET THAT PUTS YOU FIRST



My number one job as your Mayor is to listen to your concerns and work as hard as I can to deliver for you and your family.

These are uncertain and difficult times, with the cost of everything you need going up and stories of local crime combined with global instability dominating the news.

So many of you have told me it's getting harder and harder to keep up, and that you're looking to your elected representatives to have your back and be on your side.

enthusiastically backed historic investments in York Regional Police – helping put more police staff and resources on the ground to keep our community safe.

And as our city continues to grow, we are taking action to reduce gridlock so that you can spend more time with the ones you love rather than being stuck in traffic. Projects such as the Canada Drive-America Avenue Bridge and the Kirby Road and Bass Pro Mills Drive extensions are just a few examples of how we are getting shovels in the ground at a rapid pace.

This budget is a demonstration of strong, steady, responsible leadership that is focused on affordability, safety and fighting traffic.

You can count on me to keep delivering on these priorities, for you and your family.

## LEADERSHIP Mayor's Luncheon: Securing Vaughan's Future

At this year's Vaughan Chamber of Commerce Annual Mayor's Luncheon, the message was clear: the future doesn't secure itself – we must lead with stability and purpose.

Mayor Del Duca told business and community leaders that in uncertain times, strong local leadership matters. Securing Vaughan's future means creating conditions for businesses to invest and grow with confidence.

This year's budget reflects that commitment – **with no local property tax increase and no service cuts** – protecting affordability while maintaining fiscal discipline.

The Mayor also highlighted continued investments in York Regional Police, road expansions and critical infrastructure to strengthen safety and reduce gridlock.

As the status quo is tested, he committed to exploring every option – including

innovative solutions to improve housing affordability – to ensure Vaughan's future is at its best.



## SAFETY Strengthening Community Safety with Crime-Fighting Technology



Mayor Del Duca is committed to community safety through continued investments in advanced crime-fighting technology in partnership with York Regional Police.

To address vehicle theft and other crime, the City has funding for up to 10 new crime-fighting cameras. The cameras will feature automated licence plate

recognition and gunshot detection technology to support catching criminals on the run and improve response times.

Mayor Del Duca, Members of Council and City staff continue to work closely with York Regional Police and community partners to help keep Vaughan neighbourhoods safe for residents, families and businesses.

## STAYING SAFE IN VAUGHAN BEWARE OF SCAMMERS

Following reports of distraction thefts across our community, particularly affecting vulnerable older adults, I want to remind residents to remain vigilant.

These incidents often occur when an individual approaches a resident, pretending to ask for directions or assistance. In moments of distraction, valuables such as jewelry may be stolen. Residents are advised not to engage with strangers on their front lawns, driveways or in parking lots, and to trust their instincts if a situation feels suspicious.

Anyone who experiences or witnesses an attempted theft is encouraged to report it to York Regional Police. If you witness a crime in progress, make sure to call 9-1-1 right away. Reporting incidents helps authorities deploy resources and increase patrols where they are needed most.

I will continue to work closely with York Regional Police to support community safety and help keep residents informed and protected.

# Spring is around the corner!

As winter winds down, City crews are transitioning to spring maintenance activities across Vaughan, with work ramping up in March and continuing through the warmer months, weather permitting.

## Snow in spring? We've got you covered!

- Anti-icing:** Brine (a solution of rock salt and water) is applied on roads before it snows, acting as a barrier to prevent ice.
  - Salting:** Main roads and sidewalks are salted within four hours after snowfall ends; residential streets within 12 hours.
  - Plowing:** After five centimetres (two inches) of snowfall, main roads are cleared within four hours, followed by residential roads within 12 hours.
  - Windrow clearing:** Completed within four hours of plowing; small amounts may remain.
- York Region maintains regional roads.

### STAY AWAY FROM STORMWATER PONDS

Stormwater management ponds are not built for recreational use! Water constantly flows in and out of them, so the water levels are always changing, especially in the spring when melting snow and rain increase runoff, making any activity in or around them unsafe.

When frozen, the thickness of the ice is highly unpredictable, which also makes it dangerous to walk or skate on.

Always keep a safe distance from stormwater ponds.

### Spring weather changes — protect your pipes

Avoiding leaks and damage with fluctuating weather is easy with these tips:

- Shut off your indoor water supply and water heater if you're going away.
- Turn off outdoor taps.
- Keep areas that house indoor pipes above eight degrees Celsius.
- Insulate walls that are near outside walls or cold rooms.
- Seal any air leaks.

## Funding boosts Vaughan businesses

In Nov. 2025, Mayor Steven Del Duca and Ontario's Minister of Economic Development, Victor Fedeli, announced funding to support tariff-impacted workers and businesses. Through the Ontario Together Trade Fund, the province invested \$16.5 million, backing over \$120 million in investments and protecting or creating 1,500 jobs across Ontario.

Three Vaughan-based companies were spotlighted:

**Burnco Manufacturing Inc.** will receive \$2.5 million toward an expansion, creating 75 new jobs and safeguarding 215 positions.

**Heali Medical** will receive \$1.7 million to reshore production and expand into global markets, creating 12 jobs and protecting five more.

**Letar Inc.** will be receiving over \$800,000 to establish a new facility, creating nine jobs and safeguarding 32 positions.




