Purpose

To respond to the request received from the Executive Director, Epilepsy York Region, dated January 23, 2014.

Background - Analysis and Options

The correspondence received from the Executive Director, Epilepsy York Region is attached. (Attachment 1)

The proclamation request meets the City’s Proclamation Policy, as follows:

“That upon request, the City of Vaughan issue Proclamations for events, campaigns or other similar matters:

- (i) Which are promoted by any organization that is a registered charity pursuant to Section 248 of the Income Tax Act”

Epilepsy York Region, a registered charity, is seeking Council’s support in proclaiming March 2014 as “Epilepsy Awareness Month”, and March 26th, as “Purple Day”, in an effort to raise awareness of this disease as well as increase understanding, reduce the stigma and improve the quality of life for those affected by epilepsy. An estimated 50 million people worldwide and over 300,000 people across Canada are affected by this neurological condition. Council has previously granted this proclamation.
