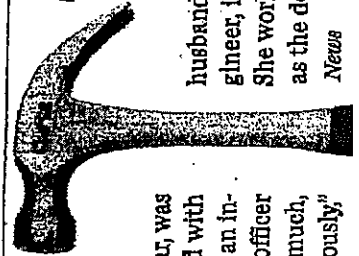

**NO BUILDING PERMIT****Complaint leads  
to resignation of  
Vancouver's deputy  
building inspector**

**Carl Edwards, whose job was to uphold Vancouver's building bylaw, has resigned after doing minor renovations on her home without a building permit. Ms. Edwards, who earned \$137,676 a year, was given six months' severance after she co-operated with an investigation that started with the complaint of an internal whistleblower. "When you are the statutory officer that is responsible for enforcing that bylaw, it is a much, much higher level of scrutiny and significance, obviously,"**



**said city manager Penny Ballem, who received the whistleblower's complaint Nov. 21. She described the value of the work as minor. Ms. Edwards, whose husband Scott is employed with the city as an engineer, is on paid leave until the end of the year. She worked for the city for 17 years, the last three as the deputy chief building inspector. *Postmedia News***
