

## NOTICE OF INTENT TO DESIGNATE UNDER THE ONTARIO HERITAGE ACT

Re: Notice of Intent to Designate 46 Monsheen Drive pursuant to Part IV, Section 29 of the *Ontario Heritage Act*.

## INTENT TO DESIGNATE UNDER THE ONTARIO HERITAGE ACT

Please take notice that the Council of the Corporation of the City of Vaughan intends to designate for reasons of cultural heritage value or interest, pursuant to Part IV, Section 29 of the *Ontario Heritage Act* the property municipally known as <u>46 Monsheen Drive</u> in the City of Vaughan, in the Province of Ontario.

## REASONS FOR PROPOSED DESIGNATION

The subject property at 46 Monsheen Drive consists of a 2-storey house constructed in 1958 on a ravine lot – part of the greater Woodview Development Housing of the Seneca Heights subdivision. The arrangement on the property is a carefully designed architectural and urbanism composition, using a colour palette aligned with the tones of the surrounding landscape, exploiting the site setback and topography to enhance the carefully designed architectural features and elements.

The property also has associative value as it is representative work of prominent Canadian architect Jerome Markson.

46 Monsheen Drive has contextual value as a surviving and exemplary example within the Seneca Heights subdivision development, also known as the Woodview Housing Development, consisting of Monsheen Drive, Tayok Drive and Wigwoss Drive, and defined by the natural wooded areas, hills and premier lots backing on the Humber River ravine built in the 1950's.
