

## Key Policy Directions:

• Plan for Provincial/Regional growth targets:

418,000 people and 265,900 jobs by 2031



- Plan for Regional Intensification targets: 31,600 new residential units in the already built-up area
- Direct growth to intensification areas: a hierarchy of Centres and Primary Intensification Corridors
- Protect stable areas:
  - Neighbourhoods are not considered areas of change:
     any redevelopment must keep the same function, lot pattern and building form
  - Employment Areas are protected for long term growth:
     retail and office uses are directed to edges of Employment Areas, Centres and Corridors
  - Countryside and Major Natural Features make up 45% of Vaughan today and will be protected to maintain a transition from urban to rural within the City
