## **BY-LAW**

## BY-LAW NUMBER 288-2002

A By-law to amend By-law 1-96, as amended, governing the parking, standing or stopping of motor vehicles on highways in the City of Vaughan.

The Council of The Corporation of the City of Vaughan ENACTS AS FOLLOWS:

 That City of Vaughan By-law Number 1-96, as amended, be and is hereby further amended by adding to section 11 subsections (2) and (3) as follows:

(2) Notwithstanding subsection 11(1), every person who contravenes section 8 of this By-law by leaving a motor vehicle parked, stopped or standing unlawfully in a designated parking space for disabled persons or who otherwise contravenes section 8 of this By-law is guilty of an offence and upon conviction is liable to a fine of not less than \$300.00 and not more than \$5,000.00.

(3) The owner of a vehicle that is parked in contravention of this By-law is guilty of an offence and upon conviction is liable to a fine or penalty as provided in this By-law or the *Provincial Offences Act*, unless the owner proves to the satisfaction of the court that at the time of the offence the motor vehicle was in the possession of another person without the owner's consent.

2. That City of Vaughan By-law Number 1-96, as amended, be and is hereby further amended by amending subsection 8 (2) to read as follows:

(2) No person shall leave a motor vehicle parked, stopped or standing in a designated parking space for disabled persons, unless a currently valid disabled person parking permit has been issued and displayed on or in the vehicle in accordance with the requirements of the <u>Highway Traffic Act</u> and any regulations made thereunder from time to time and this By-law.

 That, following final passage hereof, this By-law shall come into force and be effective on September 30<sup>th</sup>, 2002.

READ a FIRST, SECOND and THIRD time and finally passed this 23<sup>rd</sup> day of September, 2002.
