LICENSING OF TAXI SERVICES

Whereas, the question---whether these new services meet the standards which are key to the existing licensing regime---is currently at issue in the courts in Ontario, across Canada, and in other countries around the world;

It Is therefore recommended:

That appropriate staff be directed to develop and execute a public education campaign regarding taxicab services, to educate the public on the principal aim of the taxicab licensing regime; namely, to provide services that promote the health, safety and well-being of taxicab users, by ensuring that
 - a. Only individuals who are medically fit, have a valid driver's license and a good driving record, have provided a police record search and received sensitivity training are permitted to provide the service;
