 - iv) the final waste management plan and waste collection design standards submission shall be approved to the satisfaction of the Vaughan Public Works Department;
 - v) the Owner shall satisfy all requirements of the Ministry of Transportation, and obtain a Ministry Building and Land Use Permit; and,
 - vi) the Owner shall satisfy all requirements of the Region of York Transportation and Community Planning Department; and,
 - b) that the Site Plan Letter of Undertaking include the following provisions:
 - "In the EM1 Prestige Employment Zone, the Owner shall pay to the City of Vaughan by way of certified cheque, cash-in-lieu of dedication of parkland equivalent to 2% of the value of the employment/industrial land, in accordance with Section 51 of the Planning Act and the City of Vaughan's Cash-in-lieu Policy. The cash-in-lieu payment in accordance with Section 42 of the Planning Act will not be required so long as the Council Policy waiving such payment remains in effect for industrial land. In the C7 Service Commercial Zone, the Owner shall pay to the City of Vaughan by way of certified cheque, cash-in-lieu of the dedication of parkland equivalent to 2% of the value of the commercial land, in accordance with Section 42 of the Planning Act and the City of Vaughan's Cash-in-lieu Policy.

The Owner shall submit an appraisal of the subject lands (both employment/industrial and commercial lands) prepared by an accredited

appraiser for approval by the Vaughan Legal Department, Real Estate Division, and the approved appraisal shall form the basis of the cash-in-lieu payment."

ii) "That prior to release of a separate Site Plan Letter of Credit, the Owner shall design and construct at no cost to the City, a 1.5m wide sidewalk (at \$90/metre), on the east side of Weston Road between Century Place and the northern driveway (across from the 407ETR ramp), and two pedestrian connections to the sidewalk as per the approved site plan, to the satisfaction of the City of Vaughan, Region of York, 407ETR and Ministry of Transportation.
