19 CLEAN AIR COUNCIL 2012 INTERGOVERNMENTAL DECLARATION ON CLEAN AIR AND CLIMATE CHANGE

The Committee of the Whole recommends approval of the recommendation contained in the following report of the Commissioner of Strategic and Corporate Services, dated November 27, 2012:

Recommendation

The Commissioner of Strategic and Corporate Services, in consultation with the Manager of Environmental Sustainability recommend:

- 1. That the City of Vaughan commit to the Greater Toronto Clean Air Council 2012 Intergovernmental Declaration on Clean Air and Climate Change; and
- 2. That the City Clerk be requested to advise the Greater Toronto Clean Air Council accordingly.

Contribution to Sustainability

The City of Vaughan is committed to reducing emissions that contribute to climate change and which adversely affect the local air quality. This report is consistent with the priorities previously set by Council in *Green Directions Vaughan*, the Community Sustainability and Environmental Master Plan:

- Objective 1.1 to reduce greenhouse gas emissions and move towards carbon neutrality for the City of Vaughan's facilities and infrastructure
- Objective 5.1 to share sustainable best practices and ideas between and among municipal staff and the community

Economic Impact

No immediate economic impact. All of the actions covered by the declaration match up with actions documented in *Green Directions Vaughan*. Should any of the actions go beyond established budgets the regular budgeting process of submitting additional resource requests will be utilized.

Communications Plan

A communications plan is not required at this time. The Clean Air Partnership, the organization that administers the Greater Toronto Area Clean Air Council (GTA-CAC), will be posting 2012 Intergovernmental Declaration on Clean Air and Climate Change on their website.

Purpose

The purpose of this report is seek Council approval to demonstrate the City of Vaughan's support for taking meaningful actions to address air quality and climate change

Background - Analysis and Options

The GTA-CAC is made up of 26 local and regional governments in the Greater Toronto and Hamilton area along with representatives from the provincial and federal governments. The City of Vaughan is a member municipality. The GTA-CAC promotes the reduction of air pollutants and

greenhouse gas emissions and increased awareness of regional air quality and climate change issues through the collective efforts of all levels of government. The GTA-CAC regularly reports back on the progress being made to address these issues. The Clean Air Partnership, an environmental non-governmental organization based in Toronto, provides secretariat and administrative support to the GTA-CAC.

2012 Clean Air Council Inter-governmental Declaration on Clean Air and Climate Change

The GTA-CAC has been working collaboratively since 2001 to deliver GTA-CAC Intergovernmental Declarations. The Declaration outlines a statement of common understanding in the form of actions and targets as well as a progress update for ongoing work on commitments made in previous declarations and any new commitments.

The actions in the Declarations are identified and prioritized by member jurisdictions. Internal staff from the City of Vaughan collaborated to determine these priorities. The GTA-CAC takes the individual jurisdiction prioritizations to develop the final Declaration. The 25 actions in the 2012 will be signed off by all 26 members of the GTA-CAC.

By showing support for the 2012 Declaration in the form of a letter, the City of Vaughan demonstrates its commitment to continued collaboration across the region to undertake action on clean air and climate change issues.

The work plan of the GTA-CAC is determined by the final Declaration. The 2012 Declaration is found in Attachment 1.

City of Vaughan Clean Air and Climate Change Actions

The City of Vaughan continues to meet the targets and actions outlined in previous Declarations through various initiatives including the implementation of *Green Directions Vaughan*, the Transportation Master Plan, the Green Fleet Strategy, the Pedestrian and Bicycle Master Plan, transportation demand management activities, green building commitments, energy efficiency projects and various other clean air and climate change initiatives. Other commitments already confirmed by Council such as participation the Federation of Canadian Municipalities Partners for Climate Protection and Energy Management Planning mandated by the Province of Ontario will also assist the City in addressing targets and actions.

Relationship to Vaughan Vision 2020/Strategic Plan

This report is consistent with the Vaughan Vision 20/20 strategic goal of providing service excellence to citizens and the strategic objective to lead and promote environmental sustainability. This report is consistent with the priorities previously set by Council and the necessary resources have been allocated and approved.

Regional Implications

The Regional Municipality of York is also a member municipality of the GTA-CAC and actively pursuing actions and targets addressed in the Declaration.

Conclusion

The GTA-CAC is made up of 26 local and regional governments as well as provincial and federal government representatives. The 2012 Clean Air Council Intergovernmental Declaration on Clean Air and Climate Change outlines a common understanding of actions and targets, a progress update on the commitments made in previous years as well as new commitments as agreed to by members of the GTA-CAC. By signing the Declaration, the City of Vaughan shows its commitment to continued collaboration across the region to undertake action on clean air and climate change issues.
