Recommendation

The Sign Variance Committee recommends:

- 1. That Sign Variance Application SV.15-014, 1834371 Ontario Inc., be APPROVED subject to the following:
 - a) That all setback requirements are met and no parking spaces are removed; and
 - b) That the sign not be erected more than two years prior to the commencement of said construction and shall be removed within two years after commencement of construction.

Background - Analysis and Options

The applicant is proposing to install one (1) Development Sign.

Sign By-law Requirements (By-Law 203-92, as amended):

Section 12 - Development Signs:

12.1 (c) each builder is permitted a maximum of two (2) signs, with a combined sign face area not to exceed 20.0 sq.m.

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Variance Analysis:

The application is to install one V shaped development sign that is 29 sq.m. more than permitted by the Sign By-law

Proposed 49 sq.m. Allowed 20 sq.m.
