Purpose

The purpose of this report is to respond to the request received from the Minister of Human Resources and Skills Development and the Minister of State (Seniors).

Background - Analysis and Options

The correspondence from the Minister of Human Resources and Skills Development and the Minister of State (Seniors), received September 10, 2012 is attached. (Attachment 1) This request was received too late to be placed on the last Committee of the Whole meeting Agenda. Due to the time-sensitivity of the proclamation to proclaim October 1, 2012 National Seniors Day, we respectfully request that Council ratify the action taken.

The proclamation request meets the requirements of the City's Proclamation Policy as the matter relates to matters over which the City has jurisdiction. The City has proclaimed this proclamation in the past.

On October 1, 2012 the Government of Canada is encouraging communities across Canada to join together to recognize National Seniors Day. National Seniors Day focuses on celebrating and recognizing the contributions made by seniors to improve their communities, families and workplaces. Seniors are active, engaged and informed mentors and leaders and this would be an opportunity to thank and celebrate their ongoing contributions. This proclamation would also raise awareness on the many services introduced by the Government of Canada to improve the well-being and quality of life for Canada's seniors.
