Purpose

To respond to the request received from the Executive Director of the AIDS Committee of York Region (ACYR).

Background - Analysis and Options

Correspondence was received from the Executive Director of ACYR in the Office of the City Clerk.

The proclamation request meets the requirements of the City’s Proclamation Policy, as follows:

“That upon request, the City of Vaughan issue Proclamations for events, campaigns or other similar matters:

- (i) which are promoted by any organization that is a registered charity pursuant to Section 248 of the Income Tax Act”.

World AIDS Day provides an opportunity for people worldwide to unite and show their support for people living with HIV/AIDS, to commemorate those who have passed away, and to eliminate the stigma and discrimination by raising awareness about HIV/AIDS. It is estimated that more than 30, 000 people in Ontario are living with HIV, with York Region being home to over 400 people living with and impacted by HIV. ACYR is the only local non-profit organization that provides life changing supports to people living with and affected by HIV/AIDS. Council has granted this request previously.
