Waste Legislation and Waste Division Program Update

- Initiating annual report to Council on Waste Division Programs in the City of Vaughan
- Opportunity to gain Council feedback on current and future programming
- Update on the new provincial legislation, the Waste-Free Ontario Act, and coming changes to Blue Box Program Plan





Waste Division Program Update

- Achieved target waste generation rates second lowest in York Region
 - 284 kg annual waste generation per capita in 2016
- Mature organics diversion program in place for those receiving curbside collection
- Working towards waste diversion programs that include batteries, clothing/textiles and three-stream multi-residential services, to be put forward for future budget deliberations



Service Expansion – Multi-Residential Condominiums

- Phase 1 of service expansion scheduled to start with our new waste contract January 1, 2018
- Application process underway, site visits complete
- Amended Waste Collection By-law provides guidance for multi-residential condominiums, for Council review in October








- The Waste-Free Ontario Act was enacted June 1, 2016
 - Waste Diversion Transition Act & Resource Recovery and Circular **Economy Act**
- Goal of the legislation is to divert more waste from landfills, build a circular economy for these materials, and reduce greenhouse gas emissions







- Council directed City of Vaughan staff to participate in the development of the new legislation and accompanying regulations
 - In-person meetings
 - Board of Directors, Municipal Waste Association
 - Comments through the Environmental Registry
 - Final Draft Strategy for a Waste-Free Ontario: Building the Circular Economy
 - Discussion Paper: Addressing Food and Organic Waste in Ontario







- Changes to the Blue Box Program Plan are underway
- The Industry Funding Organization, Stewardship Ontario, which is funded by private sector producers, will continue to administer funding providing approximately 50% of eligible municipal Blue Box Program costs, \$1.28 million for the City of Vaughan in 2016
- Through the new legislation, Blue Box recycling collection and processing can be fully funded by private sector producers, reducing the cost of this program to the City of Vaughan







- Based on interest and support from Ontario municipalities, the Municipal 3Rs
 Collaborative advocacy working group formed early 2017
 - Association of Municipalities of Ontario
 - Municipal Waste Association
 - Regional Public Works Commissioners of Ontario
 - City of Toronto
- Municipal 3Rs Collaborative requested early transition of Blue Box Program Plan on July 7, 2017, through an accord with producer representatives





- On August 14, 2017, Chris Ballard, Minister of the Environment and Climate Change, directed Resource Productivity and Recovery Authority and Stewardship Ontario to produce an amended plan by February 15, 2018
- Consultations scheduled, with staff participating October 11, 2017
- It is expected that staff will be able to present the draft Blue Box Program Plan Amendment in January for Council review and comment
