Whereas, identifying and maintaining this area as being part of the Kleinburg community is paramount to the protection of its cultural and historical integrity as one of the four villages that contributed to creation of what is known today as the City of Vaughan, and

It is therefore recommended that Council for the City of Vaughan direct staff to notify the President and CAO of Canada Post, Mr. Deepak Chopra and the local MP, in writing, of the adopted boundaries of the Kleinburg community as identified in the Kleinburg-Nashville Community Plan of 2004 and that Council advise Canada Post that the mailing address for the Block 61 residential development be changed to properly reflect “Kleinburg” as the mailing address for this community.

I am writing to you on behalf of Nashville Developments Inc. a large landowner within Block 61 West to express our support for the motion being considered as Item 14 at the January 14, 2014 City of Vaughan Meeting of the Committee of the Whole.

During the development approval process we worked closely with the local councilor and members of both local ratepayers groups – being NARA and KARA to ensure that the community within Block 61 West respects and enhances the local heritage and character of Kleinburg-Nashville. This has included street names that reflect local history, design of homes to be consistent with the existing community and layout of the road, park and open space network. 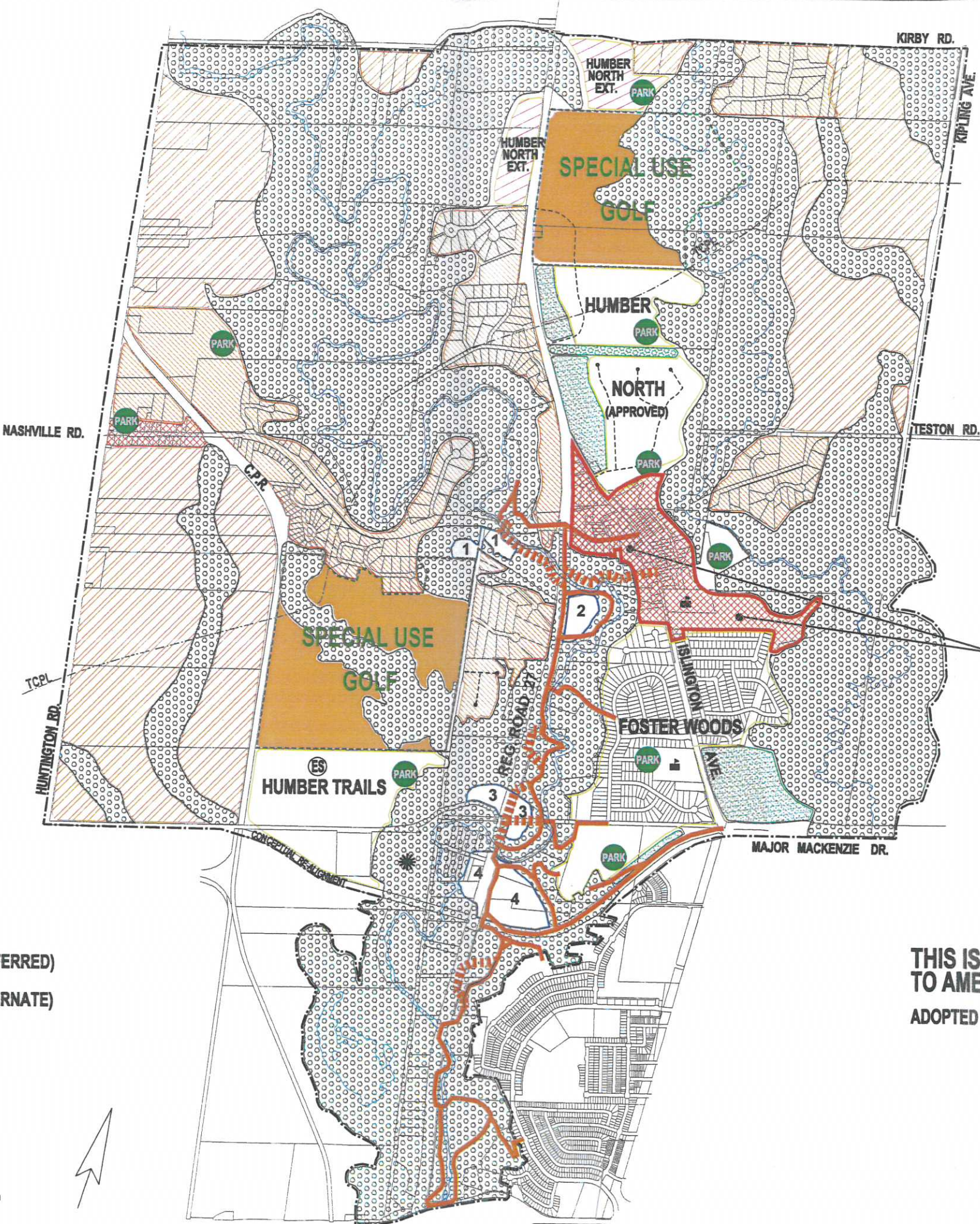

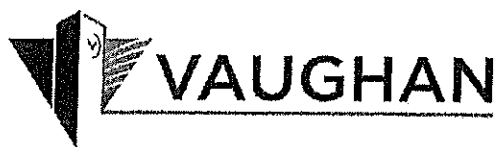

RE: Importance of Maintaining Historic Community Names

I am writing to express my concern about the Canada Post proposal to name an area of historical importance and the need for Canada Post to continue to protect this historical value.

Nashville is a hamlet of Kleinburg, in the City of Vaughan. It is on the western edge of Kleinburg. This new development area which is located in Block 61, is bound by Major Mackenzie Drive to the south, Nashville Road to the north, Huntington Road to the west and Hwy 27 to the east. This area is known as Nashville and is identified by the City of Vaughan as part of the Village of Kleinburg and is currently serviced by the Kleinburg Post Office. Canada Post has recently designated a portion of this new development in Nashville as Woodbridge. I am deeply troubled about the use of the term "Woodbridge"; seemingly to describe this area as it will generate confusion for new residents as Canada Post will identify their homes as Woodbridge and the City of Vaughan recognizes the area as Kleinburg. If feasible, Canada Post could consider the prospect of adding a new mailing name of Nashville to Canada Post's operations system.

Furthermore, the area has significant historical importance. Historic Preservation is a strategy for conserving significant elements in order to maintain a tangible connection to the past. Kleinburg was the home of the great Canadian historical writer, Pierre Berton. The connection between Mr. Berton and the village he called home and wrote so many of his great works must be preserved. Canada Post must rectify the matter and support and maintain the pride that the residents of this area have for their history.

If the prospect of a Nashville designation cannot be considered given that 5000 to 7000 new residential units will be built in the next five to seven years, then Canada Post needs to make the



necessary changes and the mailing addresses for the new community must be maintained as Kleinburg.

I hope that you will give my request the attention and consideration it deserves and that the requested change be made as soon as possible given that residents will be moving into their new homes in the coming months.



Dear Councillor Iafate:

Thank you for your letter to Mr. Deepak Chopra, President and Chief Executive Officer, regarding addressing for the Nashville-Kleinburg area. Mr. Chopra has asked me to respond.


I should explain that the City of Vaughan was originally consulted in 1991-1992 with respect to the area known as Woodbridge. At that time, the boundaries and community names were established. While we do recognize Kleinburg as an official mailing municipality, the perceived boundaries may differ from those originally established. As such, some residents in this area may be included as part of the Woodbridge addressing designation, while others may be known as Kleinburg.

Should you wish to re-evaluate the area's current distinction, as you mention, the City of Vaughan can submit a request to Canada Post representatives, at which time we will proceed with the consultation process. Many factors will be considered, including the impact of potential postal code changes.

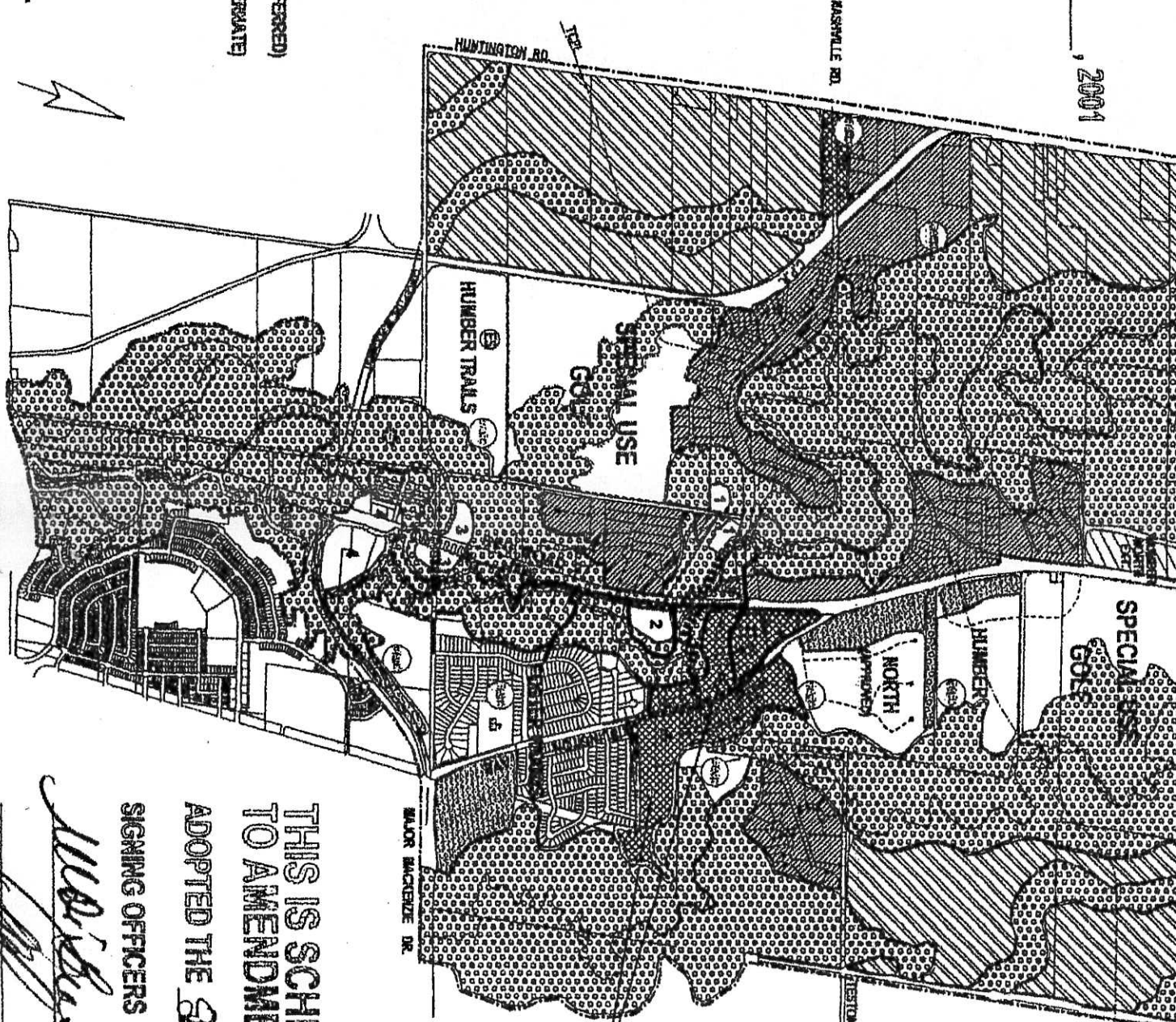
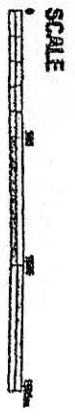
