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**WARD 2 – PROPOSED PURCHASE OF WOODLOT**

The Committee of the Whole recommends approval of the recommendation contained in the following resolution submitted by Councillor Carella, dated January 14, 2014:

***Whereas***, the approved residential development known as the Ravines of Rainbow Creek---located north of Langstaff Road and west of the CP rail line---will eventually include a public playground and extensive public open space including storm water management ponds, railway buffer berms, and the banks of Rainbow Creek, as indicated in the attached plan; and

***Whereas***, a small, soon to be landlocked woodlot owned by CP Rail abuts the playground area; and

***Whereas***, the addition of the aforementioned woodlot to the inventory of open space would greatly enhance the level of public amenities in the local community;

***Now therefore be it resolved***, that the Manager, Real Estate, be directed to obtain an appraisal of the value of the CP parcel, to determine whether the addition of these lands to the inventory of public space in the immediate area can be effected at a reasonable cost to the municipality.

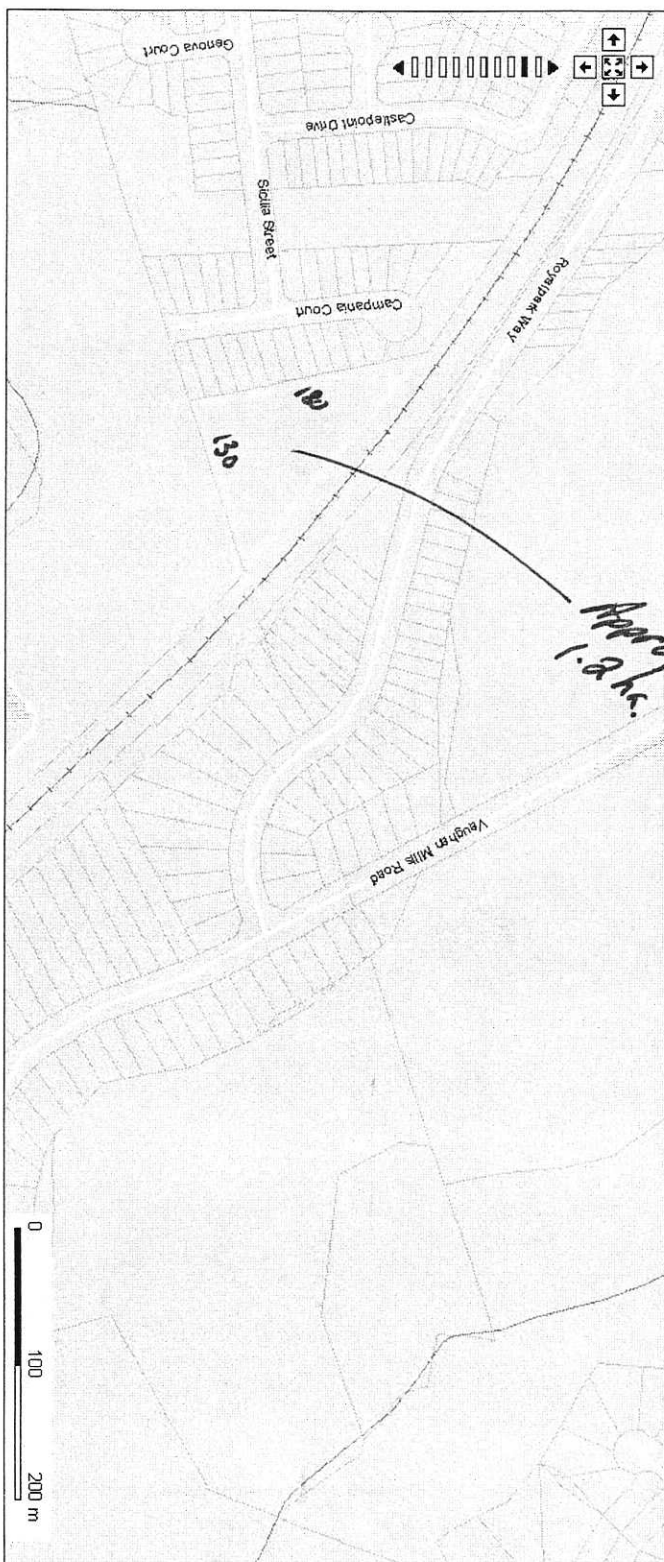
