Background - Analysis and Options

In 2010, York Region Council approved the establishment of the Human Services Planning Board with a mandate to enhance the effectiveness and efficiency of human services in York Region through capacity building with the York Region human services sector and through collaborative advocacy. The Board is a York Region led multi-sector collaborative of human service organizations/agencies/networks, community leaders and government advisor and resource members and is co-chaired by Regional Councillor John Taylor, Town of Newmarket and Susan LaRosa, past Director of Education, York Catholic District School Board.

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to take action to curb this trend. Leveraging the many strengths of York Region, the Board believes that the *Making Ends Meet in York Region* initiative will serve to advance a legacy of healthy, complete and inclusive communities.

The process of identifying the area of focus for the Board started with a broader examination of York Region through a social determinant of health framework. The customized list of social determinants includes the following economic and social conditions that shape the health of individuals and communities:

- Income
- Housing
- Education
- Early childhood development
- Employment and training
- Access to health
- Social and community services/supports
- Food security
- · Inclusiveness and integration

Under each area, the Board members looked at the current state in order to come to an agreement where they would focus their attention. They identified *Making Ends Meet in York Region* as the priority area of focus for their work. The financial struggle of low and moderate income residents in York Region is the challenge that resonated with each Board member.

In May of 2012, the Board presented to York Region Council their Year in Review for 2011, outlining their accomplishments and future plans. The Board identified eight Collective Actions to achieve desired outcomes based on their analysis. The actions will require facilitating and coordinating new partnerships and outreach efforts to build awareness in the community about the importance of helping low and moderate income families and individuals make ends meet. The Collective Actions are:

- 1. Host a Housing Affordability Discussion
- 2. Housing Hub Model
- 3. Host a Social Assistance Review Commission Options Paper Discussion
- 4. Mentoring Partnership Program
- 5. Convening Public Education and Awareness Meeting House Series
- 6. Funder Discussions
- 7. Financial Literacy Tools
- 8. Fair Access

York Region Council endorsed the presentation and requested that the Board offer to present to local municipal Committee or Council meetings regarding the *Making Ends Meet in York Region* initiative to explore opportunities for local municipal involvement in the Collective Actions. To date, presentations have been held in Town of Georgina, Town of East Gwillimbury, Township of King and Town of Richmond Hill. In addition to the City of Vaughan, future presentations have been confirmed for the City of Markham and Town of Newmarket. The presentations provide a background on the Human Services, Planning Board, the *Making Ends Meet in York Region* initiative and focus on Housing and Fair Access actions.



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
