3. Lower the Town's flags to half-mast.

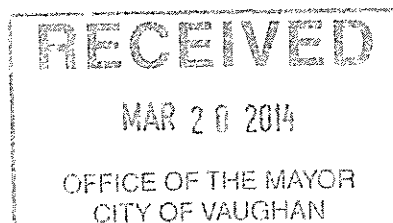
