The Relay will commence on May 29, 2015 and will take place over 41 days, and include more than 2000 torchbearers, 5000 kilometers on the road, 15,000 kilometers in the air, visiting more than 130 communities and alternative modes of transportation including plane, train and ferry boat.

The Torch relay route and Celebration Communities will be announced in October 2014, until then, the torch relay route communities are confidential.
