Background - Analysis and Options

Vaughan Council Action

On December 10, 2013, Vaughan Council approved the City of Vaughan Street Naming Policy and Procedures that includes a Street Name Reserve List and a Heritage Street Name Reserve List, and adopted the following recommendation (in part) of the Committee of the Whole:

"That the Street Name Reserve List contained in Communication #5, submitted by Councillors Shefman and Carella, be received by staff for review and consideration for addition to the Street Name Reserve List."

In addition, following the Vaughan Council meeting, Councillor Marilyn Iafrate provided additional heritage street names to the Planning Department for review and consideration for addition to the city's current Heritage Street Name Reserve List and intended for use in the Kleinburg community.

The City's existing Street Name Reserve List and existing Heritage Street Name Reserve List contains Vaughan Council pre-approved street names that can be used by landowners in future developments (city-wide) without the need to have proposed new street names approved by Vaughan Council, thereby expediting the street name approval process.

Street Name Review

Councillors Shefman and Carella, and lafrate have proposed the street names shown on Attachments #1 and #2, respectively, which originate from the following:

- Local Councillors Alan Shefman and Tony Carella proposed the street names shown on Attachment #1, which were included in Communication C5 received by Vaughan Council on December 10, 2013. The suggested street names have a Canadian, Provincial, and local reference and are derived from three primary sources: John Roberts Colombo, Colombo's Canadian Reference, Oxford (Toronto 1976); Ministry of Transportation Official Road Map of Ontario; and, Archival Services at the City of Vaughan. It is proposed that these street names be added to the City of Vaughan's Street Name Reserve List, for use in new development across the City.
- Local Councillor Marilyn lafrate proposed the street names included on Attachment #2 that originates from works by the Group of Seven and Pierre Berton intended for use in the Kleinburg community. It is proposed that these street names be added to the current City of Vaughan Heritage Street Name Reserve List for use in new development in the Kleinburg community.

The Vaughan Planning Department reviewed the original list of street names attached to Communication C5 and the street names provided by Councillor lafrate and deleted all the street names that the Department is aware are used and / or reserved in the Region of York. The Vaughan Fire and Rescue Department and York Region subsequently reviewed an edited list of street names shown for appropriateness with the Street Name Policy. A total of 506 street names were included on Communication C5, of which 203 were approved and 303 were declined. A total of 46 street names were included on the list provided by Councillor lafrate of which, 40 were approved and 6 were declined. Should Vaughan Council approve this report, the street names shown on Attachments #1 and #2 will be added to the City's Street Name Reserve List, and the City's Heritage Street Name Reserve List for use in the Kleinburg Community.

The Planning Department is satisfied that the approved street names shown on Attachments #1 and #2 meet the City of Vaughan Street Naming Policy and Procedures and recommend that they be added to the City's Street Name Reserve List (city-wide) and Street Name Heritage Reserve List (currently comprised of 99 names for city-wide use, plus the 40 new names to be applicable to the Kleinburg Community), respectively. In addition, the Vaughan Planning Department supports the use of the street names on Attachment #2 for use in the Kleinburg community only as they reflect literary and artistic works associated with individuals in the local community and the McMichael Art Gallery (i.e. Pierre Berton and Group of Seven).

Relationship to Vaughan Vision 2020/Strategic Plan

This report and the street names proposed are consistent with the priorities set forth in Vaughan Vision 2020, particularly "Plan and Manage Growth and Economic Vitality".

Regional Implications
