Whereas, one of the unintended consequences of “new urbanism” is the general lack of off-street parking spaces---the result of shorter driveways or narrowed laneways leading to garages that will accommodate a maximum of two cars. Whereas, the result is invariably an ongoing record of parking tickets, frequently totaling in the hundreds of dollars;

Whereas, while some suggest that the responsibility lies with the homeowner, to choose a home that will accommodate all of the cars belonging to the household, the practice found in older municipalities where parking is limited, if not non-existent, recommends itself: permit parking on street, for a fee.
