8 LA NEVE AVENUE ON-STREET PERMIT PARKING PILOT PROJECT REVIEW WARD 2

The Committee of the Whole recommends:

- 1) That the recommendation contained in the following report of the Deputy City Manager of Public Works and the Director of Transportation Services, Parks and Forestry Operations, dated November 7, 2017, be approved; and
- 2) That the following deputations be received:
 - 1. Ms. Pina Scavuzzo, La Neve Avenue, Woodbridge; and
 - 2. Mr. Yiu Man Win, La Neve Avenue, Woodbridge.

Recommendation

The Deputy City Manager of Public Works and the Director of Transportation Services, Parks and Forestry Operations, in consultation with the Director of By-law & Compliance, Licensing & Permit Services recommend:

- That Council not extend or renew the on-street permit parking pilot project on La Neve Avenue; and
- 2. That the existing signs on La Neve Avenue be removed.

Contribution to Sustainability

This report contributes to the goals and objectives within Green Directions Vaughan, the City's Community Sustainability and Environmental Master Plan, specifically:

Goal 3: To ensure that Vaughan is a city that is easy to get around with a low environmental impact.

The provision of on-street parking can impact the road operations, as road space is provided to accommodate parking and traffic requires to manoeuvre through the adjacent parking lane. La Neve Avenue is a two-lane north-south local roadway with 8.0 metre pavement width and no sidewalks on either side of the street.

Economic Impact

The discontinuation of the parking pilot project will require the removal of the existing Permit Parking signs. An estimated amount of \$300 will be required to remove the signs.

A maximum of seven (7) permits are typically sold in any given month, at a rate of \$50 per permit. Annual revenue of approximately \$4,200 would cease with the discontinuation of the project.

Communications Plan

The La Neve Avenue on-street permit parking pilot project was initiated in part through a petition of a limited number of residents. A follow up survey to all affected residents was conducted as part of the pilot project assessment. The residents of La Neve Avenue will be notified of the report outcome.

EXTRACT FROM COUNCIL MEETING MINUTES OF NOVEMBER 21, 2017

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Purpose

To provide an update and recommendation to Council on the one-year on-street permit parking pilot project on La Neve Avenue.

Background - Analysis and Options

The La Neve on-street permit parking pilot project was initiated in October 2016.

At the June 28th, 2016 Council meeting, Council approved a member's resolution to implement an overnight permit parking pilot for one year on La Neve Avenue, starting October 1, 2016. A staff report was presented at the September 7, 2016 council meeting to amend the Parking By-law for the issuing of permits and collection of fees, as the Charges By-law must reflect the corresponding fee (See Attachment No. 2). The by-law provision enacted to give effect to the pilot included an automatic sunset clause with a date of September 30, 2017. Transportation Services, Parks and Forestry Operations undertook an assessment of La Neve Avenue and determined that up to thirteen (13) permits may be issued.

La Neve Avenue is a two-lane north-south local roadway with a 17.5 m right-of-way (8.0 metre pavement width). There are no sidewalks on either side of the street. A map of the area is shown in Attachment No. 1.

A Survey was delivered to the residences on La Neve Avenue and a majority of the responses were in support of discontinuing the on-street permit parking.

A survey was delivered to all residences on La Neve Avenue near the end of the one-year permit parking pilot project. Residents were asked if they would like to keep the on-street permit parking or have it discontinued.

A total of fifty (50) surveys were distributed to the residents on La Neve Avenue. A large majority of responses were in favour of discontinuing the on-street permit parking. Thirty-four (34) responses were received in support of removing the on-street permit parking and three (3) responses were received in favour of keeping the on-street permit parking.

A review of calls during winter operations on La Neve Avenue identified a complaint that parked cars were negatively impacting the snow plow operations. Residents also had concerns with the street being narrow with no sidewalks for pedestrians, a condition not suitable for on-street parking. There were no complaints received pertaining to waste collection.

A review of the number of permits sold on La Neve Avenue showed a maximum of only seven (7) permits sold in any month.

Based on the survey and feedback from residents following the one-year pilot project, it is recommended that the on-street permit parking on La Neve Avenue be discontinued.

The survey of residents of La Neve Avenue showed more than two-third (2/3) or sixty-eight per cent (68%) were in favour of removing the on-street permit parking and returning to the City's standard parking by-law regulations. The survey of residents showed only 6% were in favour of having on-street permit parking.

Non-renewal of the parking pilot project will require the removal of the existing permit parking signs.



Item 16, Report No. 31, of the Committee of the Whole, which was adopted without amendment by the Council of the City of Vaughan on September 20, 2016.

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LA NEVE PARKING PILOT PROJECT

The Committee of the Whole recommends approval of the recommendation contained in the following report of the Director of By-law & Compliance, Licensing & Permit Services, dated September 7, 2016:

Recommendation

The Director of By-law & Compliance, Licensing & Permit Services, in consultation with the Director of Transportation Services, Parks & Forestry Operations and the City Solicitor recommends:

- 1. That the Parking By-law No. 1-96, as amended, be amended:
 - a. to provide for a one-year pilot project for resident overnight on-street permit-parking on the east side of La Neve Avenue; and
 - b. to bring all the relevant schedules up to date with the current permit parking practices;
- 2. That the Fees and Charges By-law No. 171-2013, as amended, be amended to include monthly fees for 2016, 2017 and 2018 for all occupant on-street parking permits; and
- 3. That staff be authorized to undertake any other actions required to implement the oneyear permit-parking pilot project on La Neve Avenue.

Contribution to Sustainability

Development and intensification continue to create additional resident parking pressures that are difficult to alleviate exclusively through off-street parking. To support sustainable growth the City continues to support initiatives that address growth pressures and maintain or improve livability.

As part of its ongoing commitment to explore parking alternatives for residents, the City continues to support on-street permit parking pilot projects on streets where it is both technically feasible and where the affected residents are generally in favour of the pilot project.

Economic Impact

Work associated with the proposed pilot includes an engineering assessment, sign installation, and administration and enforcement. The projected net cost of approximately \$300 will be absorbed within the existing approved budgets of By-Law, Compliance, Licensing and Permit Services and Transportation Services, Parks and Forestry Operations ("TSPFO").

TSPFO has determined that up to 13 parking spaces along La Neve Avenue can be provided as part of the pilot. The monthly permit fee, in accordance with established practice, will be \$50. If all 13 residents take up permits over the entire course of the pilot project, revenues will be \$7,800. However, staff expect the uptake to be no higher than 85% (based on the number of residents that signed a petition requesting overnight on-street parking*), which would then generate revenue of approximately \$6,600. The net economic impact is summarized below:

Of all the streets being added to the By-law's schedules, only Napa Valley Boulevard and La Neve Avenue are residential streets with overnight parking (i.e., between 2:00 a.m. and 6:00 a.m.). For the remaining streets, permits are available to allow parking only between the times of 6:00 a.m. and 6:00 p.m.

Staff will track and assess resident uptake, as well as issues and challenges arising from the pilot at La Neve Avenue, and will report back to Council with any additional recommendations.

Relationship to Term of Council Service Excellence Strategy Map (2014-2018)

The recommendations in this report support City Council's priorities by helping to improve the municipal network and the safety and well-being of citizens.

The recommendations are also consistent with the Vaughan Service Excellence Strategic Initiatives of Citizen Experience and Operational Performance through effective and consistent service delivery, continuous improvement, and demonstrating value for money.

Regional Implications

There are no regional implications as a result of the recommendations of this report.

Conclusion

The recommended amendments provide for a one-year resident overnight on-street permit parking pilot on La Neve Avenue. Prior to the conclusion of the pilot, staff will report back to Council on the uptake by residents and whether the on-street parking created any challenges.

The recommended amendments also bring both the Parking By-law and the Fees and Charges By-law in line with prior Council resolutions with respect to on-street parking permits.
