Only a year later, on March 29, 2008, Earth Hour had become a global sustainability movement with more than 50 million people across 35 countries participating. The World Wildlife Fund (WWF), a global environmental non-profit organization, assists with coordinating the Earth Hour program.

Highlights from WWF's Earth Hour 2017 include:

- 187 countries and territories across all seven continents participated globally with over 3,000 landmarks switching off their lights; and
