 - Interim solution until 2020




Accreditation with Exemplary Standing – Again!

Our Two Large Municipalities are Growing Ever Quicker as They Become Urban Areas







Higher Yearly Volumes of Patients in the Emergency Department than Many of the Large Downtown Hospitals



Highest Growth in Emergency Volumes in Our Region




Highest Growth in Overall EMS Volumes in Our Region



She said the \$157 million in funding will do little to east hospital overcrowding




Mackenzie Health's Unique Evolution to a Two-Hospital Model



- The Ministry of Health approved the need to add a new hospital to address the dramatic need of our communities
- Of 17 hospital builds in Ontario since 1980, Mackenzie Vaughan
 Hospital is the largest ever increment to the system and the first EVER net
 new hospital that will not replace a decommissioned site



Infrastructure Ontario - Phases




