POLICY STATEMENT

A policy governing the presence of media at designated voting places during periods in which voting is taking place.

PURPOSE

The objective of this policy is to provide clear direction on the protocol for authorizing limited media presence and coverage of voting places in a manner which does not compromise the integrity, security and secrecy of the electoral process for election officials and electors at a voting place.

SCOPE

This policy applies to all election officials designated by the City Clerk, candidates, electors and media present at a voting place during the conduct of a municipal election or by-election in the City of Vaughan.

LEGISLATIVE AUTHORITY AND REQUIREMENTS

Municipal Elections Act, 1996:

Powers of clerk

12 (1) A clerk who is responsible for conducting an election may provide for any matter or procedure that,

(a) is not otherwise provided for in an Act or regulation; and

(b) in the clerk's opinion, is necessary or desirable for conducting the election.

1996, c. 32, Sched., s. 12 (1).

Secrecy

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49 (1) Every person who is present in a voting place or at the counting of the votes shall help to maintain the secrecy of the voting. 1996, c. 32, Sched., s. 49 (1).

Offences

(2) No person shall,

- (a) interfere or attempt to interfere with an elector who is marking the ballot;
- (b) obtain or attempt to obtain, at a voting place, information about how an elector intends to vote or has voted; or
- (c) communicate any information obtained at a voting place about how an elector intends to vote or has voted. 1996, c. 32, Sched., s. 49 (2).

Same, revealing a vote

(3) No elector shall,

- (a) take a photograph or video recording of his or her marked ballot; or
- (b) show his or her marked ballot to any person so as to reveal how he or she has voted, except in connection with obtaining assistance in voting under paragraph 4 of subsection 52 (1). 2016, c. 15, s. 36.

No requirement of disclosure

(4) No person shall, in a legal proceeding relating to an election, be required to disclose how he or she voted at the election. 1996, c. 32, Sched., s. 49 (4).

DEFINITIONS

Media: Any person or organization intending to disseminate information to the public through print, radio, television, internet (including blogs) or social media.

Voting Place: A location designated by the City Clerk pursuant to section 45 of the *Municipal Elections Act.* The Voting place shall include the entire building, including all common areas and the entire property on which the building is located, and which has been permitted or leased to the City Clerk for election purposes, but does not include residences in a multi-residential property.

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- 1. Except where otherwise stated in this policy, members of the media may not attend or remain at a Voting Place to film or photograph at that Voting Place.
- 2. Prior to Advance Voting or Voting Day (as applicable), media may make a request to the City Clerk to film or photograph at a Voting Place.
- 3. Requests from media may be received by staff from the Office of the City Clerk or from the Strategic and Corporate Communications Department, who shall coordinate those requests through the City Clerk or their designate, for consideration and approval.
- 4. Where Media attends a voting place without making a request or having received advanced approval by the City Clerk, or their designate, the election official responsible for that Voting Place shall immediately notify Election Central for official direction.
- 5. The election official responsible for a Voting Place may deny access to the voting place until they have received direction from Election Central.
- 6. The City Clerk, or their designate, shall review all media requests and provide direction to the requestor on protocol at the Voting Place when approving the request to film or photograph.
- 7. Where permission has been granted to film or photograph inside the Voting Place, media will conduct filming and photography from the main entryway only. If this direction is not adhered to, the election official responsible for the Voting Place may request that the media leave the Voting Place.
- 8. The election official responsible for a Voting Place shall ensure that election officials and electors present have provided explicit consent to being filmed or photographed prior to such filming or photographing.
- 9. At all times, the privacy and security of the electoral process is paramount. If an election official is given cause to believe that an elector's right to privacy is being breached, or that the peace and security of the Voting Place is being disturbed, they may request that the media immediately depart the Voting Place.
