- 3. That Capital Project PK-6476-20 Matthew Park Shade Structure be advanced from 2020 to 2017 and be increased by \$5,000 to a total budget of \$140,000, funded \$ 93,800 from the capital taxation reserve and \$46,200 from approved grant funding;
- 4. That staff be authorized to enter into single source contracts for the design and installation of shade structures at North Thornhill Community Centre and Matthew Park;
- 5. In July of 2015 the City received \$780,171 from the first intake of the Canada 150 Community Infrastructure Program, \$143,063 of which is to support completion of two (2) parks development infrastructure renewal projects including Oakbank Pond Boardwalk Reconstruction (Ward 5) and North Thornhill Community Centre Playground Shade Structure (Ward 4). Funding for completion of these projects was approved as part of the 2016 Capital Budget and implementation of these projects is already in progress.

In late December of 2016 the City was advised it was successful in securing an additional \$300,300 in Federal grant funding from the second intake of the Canada 150 Community Infrastructure Program for three (3) additional parks development projects including Maxey Park Playground Expansion (Ward 2), Chancellor District Park Playground Redevelopment (Ward 3) and Matthew Park Shade Structure (Ward 3). This recent approval brings the total amount of Federal grant funding received for Parks Development projects under the Canada 150 Community Infrastructure Program to \$443,363.

Purpose

The purpose of this report is to seek Council approval for budget amendments and proposed procurement plans for implementation of Canada 150 Community Infrastructure Program grant projects in order to expedite project completion before the stated deadline of March 31, 2018.

Background - Analysis and Options

In June 2016 Council considered Item 42, Report No. 27 of the Committee of the Whole which recommended that an application package be submitted for the second intake of the Canada 150 Community Infrastructure Program. The list of proposed projects to be considered for grant funding under this program included 20 projects with a total cost of \$7.1 million with potential Federal funding of up to \$2.3 million.

In late December of 2016 the City was advised that it was successful in securing grant funding totaling \$300,300 as part of the second intake for Canada 150 grant funding. The successful projects include Maxey Park Playground Expansion (Ward 2), Chancellor District Park Playground Redevelopment (Ward 3) and Matthew Park Shade Structure (Ward 3). Prior to this, the City previously secured Federal grant funding of \$143,063 as part of the initial intake of the Canada 150 Community Infrastructure Program for the completion of the Oakbank Pond Boardwalk Reconstruction and North Thornhill Community Centre Playground Shade Structure.

The deadline for completion of all projects (both intake 1 and intake 2) under the Canada 150 Community Infrastructure Program is March 31, 2018. The initial two (2) projects have already been started and the additional three (3) projects are planned to begin immediately, however this will require a reprioritization of parks development projects.

Accessibility improvements and integration of the existing water play area will be incorporated into the overall playground design and redevelopment. Conceptual designs are in progress by staff as well as the hiring of a consultant Landscape Architect to lead this project to completion. A public consultation process will be developed in coordination with the local Ward Councillor. Project details and proposed procurement for this project are as follows:
