

Support age-friendly, complete communities


- Age-friendly, complete communities workshop held in November 2017 highlighted areas of common interest

- Mid-Range Income Housing Incentive Framework


Implementation is Underway

 - Medical information kits for seniors for use by paramedics when responding to 911 calls






Successful Implementation Means...

- Program decisions made based on multiple sources of evidence
- More places for seniors to access integrated services
- Greater focus on prevention to mitigate some of the risks associated with aging
- Seniors and caregivers are supported to navigate and access the system
- Decrease in non-emergency 911 calls by seniors
- Resources and subsidies are targeted to those that need it the most, regardless of age
