Purpose

The purpose of this report and associated presentation from York Region Rapid Corporation (YRRTC) staff is to provide Council with the status of the rapid transit projects in Vaughan.

Background – Analysis and Options

The construction of the Toronto-York Spadina Subway Extension is well underway and the three stations in Vaughan are taking shape. The first stage of the VivaNext Rapidway in Vaughan (H2-VMC), which extends along Highway 7 from Edgeley Boulevard to approximately Bowes Road, is under construction and scheduled to be completed concurrently with the opening of the Toronto-York Spadina Subway Extension in 2016.

YRRTC is currently engaged in the design stage of the next phase of the H2 Rapidway, which extends west of Edgeley Boulevard to approximately Helen Street and east of Bowes Road. Accordingly, staff has arranged a presentation from YRRTC staff which will provide more details on the current status of the following transit projects:
