

Project: Stormwater Ponds Restoration (VAU-014/021/020)

Updated: March 22, 2018

Description:

A stormwater pond is a man-made pond used to manage surface water runoff from urban areas.

Accumulated sediment (soil, rocks, other solid objects that collect at the bottom of pond) will be removed to improve functionality of the stormwater pond. Sediment removal will also improve water quality in the pond.

Benefits to Community:

Most of the targeted ponds are in commercial and light industrial locations so there will be a strong likelihood that the pond cleanouts will be beneficial in improving the health of the area watersheds. A watershed is the area where water collects from various streams before being directed to other larger streams and lakes.
