

 - Create a Bicycle Advisory Committee






- Ontario Traffic Manual Book 18











Bike Lanes Implementation Update

Council Recommendation (January 2014)

 "That the implementation of dedicated bicycle lanes along Peter Rupert Avenue (Ward 4) and Napa Valley Drive (Ward 2) be deferred pending Council approval of a supplementary program for engaging residents in the planning of bicycle lanes in these areas and the execution of said program to the satisfaction of Council."


