
The development framework ensures high quality design standards for built form as well as architectural variety and fit

Development transitions respectfully to existing areas



Street Network



- Ensure a permeable block pattern and a fine network of vehicular and pedestrian connections
- Ensure increased **public access** and a hierarchy of **linkages to main streets**, new neighbourhoods, parks and open space amenities






- Define the hierarchy of gateways using signage, enhanced landscaping, enhanced streetscape materials, and built form
- Protect the **view corridors** that demarcate the gateways

Building Height and Relation to Public Realm



within the HCD:

- must be sympathetic to the heritage character and attributes described in the Woodbridge HCD Plan and
- provide an appropriate transition.


adjacent to listed or designated properties:

 must be sympathetic to the heritage character and attributes identified as part of the listing and/or in the Designation Report.








Building height measurement for a mansard roof
