Waste Collection Program

The City of Vaughan provides waste collection services to all eligible residential properties. This includes the collection of garbage, blue box recycling, green bin organics, leaf and yard waste, Christmas trees, and appliance/metal items.



Set waste materials out no earlier than 6 p.m. the night before collection and no later than 7 a.m. on your collection day.

WASTE COLLECTION FREQUENCY

To determine which week your garbage is collected:

- 1. Identify where you live on the map shown on the back cover
- 2. Identify your collection day and determine if you live in a **BLUE ZONE**

or a **YELLOW ZONE**

3. Follow your colour throughout the calendar



Green bin (organic) and **blue box (recycling)** collection is **every week**.



Garbage collection is **every other week**.

Refer to page 5 for weight, quantity and size limits.



Yard waste is collected weekly in the spring and fall and every other week in the summer.

There is no yard waste collection during the winter months. Refer to page 13 for dates.

Garbage Collection



• Regulation-sized garbage bags

 Regulation-sized containers with handles and removable lids Maximum diameter: 0.5 metres (19 inches)
 Maximum height: 0.9 metres (35 inches)

WEIGHT, QUANTITY AND SIZE LIMIT

WEIGHT LIMIT: 20.4 kilograms (45 pounds) per item, including contents of bag/bin and/or bundled material

OUANTITY LIMIT:

- Three items every other week (including bulky items)
- Paid garbage tags are required on extra items over three, up to a maximum of 13 items

SIZE LIMIT:

Bundles: 1.5 metres (five feet) in length and 0.6 metres (two feet) in diameter

Bulky Items: 68 kilograms (150 pounds)



UNACCEPTABLE CONTAINERS

- Broken or damaged containers
- Cardboard boxes
- Containers with attached lids
- Grocery-type shopping bags
- Laundry-type baskets and/or similar containers
- Oversized containers or bags



BROKEN GLASS AND OTHER SHARP OBJECTS

These items must be placed in a cardboard box that is safely secured and labelled "broken glass".

USE PROPER CONTAINERS

Waste materials will only be collected if proper containers are used.

Christmas Tree Collection



Christmas trees are collected on your regular collection day during the weeks of Jan. 5 or 12.

If you miss your Christmas tree collection, you can drop off your tree at the **Bloomington Yard Waste Depot**, 1351 Bloomington Rd., in Richmond Hill at no charge or set it out for pickup during the City's spring leaf and yard collection program from April 5 to May 27.



REMINDERS:

- Christmas trees larger than 2.13 metres (seven feet)
 cannot fit into the collection vehicles and are required
 to be cut in half.
- Christmas trees buried in, on top of or behind snowbanks may not get collected. Please ensure your tree is accessible.

What Goes in the Blue Box



ACCEPTABLE ITEMS

- Beverage cartons and polycoat containers (e.g. juice boxes, milk cartons)
- Cardboard boxes, flattened
- Glass bottles and jars
- Metal: steel cans and tins, aluminum (including foil rolled in a ball)
- Paper products and newsprint
- Plastic food and drink containers
- Plastic household containers

All containers must be empty and clean. Metal lids must be removed and placed in the blue box separately.





ACCEPTABLE CONTAINERS

14 - 22 gal.



Blue Box (Recycling)

- Blue boxes provided by the City
- Blue boxes purchased at participating stores that are similar in size to those offered by the City
- Material bundled appropriately beside the blue box
- Maximum bundle size is 0.6 metres x 0.6 metres x
 0.3 metres (two feet x two feet x one foot)



UNACCEPTABLE ITEMS

- Batteries, propane cylinders or other hazardous waste
- Boxes with food or grease stains (e.g. greasy pizza boxes)
- Coat hangers
- Foam packaging
- Glass cookware, light bulbs, mirrors, drinking glasses, ceramics
- Medical waste (e.g. needles)
- Plastic bags or film
- Plastic wrap or straws, foil drink pouches (e.g. Kool-Aid Jammers)
- Pots or pans
- Soiled paper, paper towels, tissue, waxed paper, chip bags
- Styrofoam, foam egg cartons or take-out containers



UNACCEPTABLE CONTAINERS

- Cardboard boxes
- Containers with attached lids
- Containers with wheels
- Garbage containers
- Oversized containers
- Semi-opaque plastic garbage/recycling bags

ACCEPTABLE ITEMS

- Baked goods and baking ingredients
- Dairy products
- Fruit and vegetables
- Grain products
- Meat and fish products
- Other food products including candy, tea bags, coffee grounds and filters
- Paper products, including soiled newsprint
- Personal hygiene products (e.g. diapers, sanitary products)
- Pet waste and food



ACCEPTABLE CONTAINERS

- Green bins provided by the City
- Green bins purchased at participating stores that are similar in size to the ones offered by the City

- Cardboard boxes
- Regular garbage containers or bags



REMINDERS:

- USE COMPOSTABLE BAGS. Do not place food containers in your green bin. ONLY organic materials are accepted.
- Material must be bagged and tied inside the green bin No loose material is allowed.

Leaf and Yard Waste Collection



ACCEPTABLE ITEMS

- Corn stalks and pumpkins
- Fruit and vegetables
- Grass, leaves and garden plants
- Shrubbery and tree clippings

Excess yard waste can be dropped of at the **Bloomington Yard Waste Depot**, see page 24.



UNACCEPTABLE ITEMS

- Animal feces
- Dirt and soil
- Non-organic materials (e.g. flower pots)
- Leaf and yard waste mixed with other waste
- Kitchen organic waste
- Root balls
- Sod
- Stumps
- Tree trunks



ACCEPTABLE CONTAINERS

- Paper bags used for leaf and yard waste
- Waste containers without lids and with handles marked "Leaf and Yard Waste"



UNACCEPTABLE CONTAINERS

- Cardboard boxes
- Degraded paper bags
- Green bins or blue boxes
- Plastic bags
- Unmarked containers and/or containers with lids on them



LEAF AND YARD WASTE COLLECTION:

Fall WEEKLY Collection (2015):

Oct. 6 to Nov. 27 on your regular collection day

Spring WEEKLY Collection (2016):

April 5 to May 27 on your regular collection day

Summer Collection (2016):

EVERY OTHER WEEK from May 31 to Sept. 30 on your regular collection day

Fall WEEKLY Collection (2016):

Oct. 4 to Nov. 25 on your regular collection day

SIZE LIMIT:

Bundles: 1.5 metres (five feet) in length

and 0.6 metres (two feet) in diameter

Branches: Branches must be securely bundled

and no longer than 10 centimetres (four inches) in diameter per branch

Double-Up Days



Take advantage of **Double-Up Days** to dispose of up to six items of garbage on your designated garbage collection day without the need for paid garbage tags. **Thirteen item maximum still applies during Double-Up Days**.

There are four Double-Up Day events each year:

Weeks of: Nov. 10 and 17, 2015

Jan. 5 and 12, 2016

April 5 and 12, 2016

Sept. 6 and 13, 2016 Nov. 8 and 15, 2016

REPLACEMENTS FOR DAMAGED CITY-ISSUED GREEN BIN/BLUE BOX

No-charge replacements for damaged City-issued green bins and blue boxes are available only at:

- City of Vaughan Joint Operations Centre, 2800 Rutherford Rd.
- Vaughan Environmental Day events held throughout the year

Residents must bring in their City-issued damaged green bin, blue box or kitchen container to be eligible for a no-charge replacement.

NOTE: Damaged garbage bins will not be replaced by the City.



REMINDERS:

- The City does not issue refunds for green bins, blue boxes, garbage tags, backyard composters or kitchen containers.
- Participating stores also sell green bins and blue boxes. Prices
 may vary. Purchased green bins and blue boxes used in the City's
 program must be similar in size to those distributed by the City.
 Damaged non City-issued bins will not be replaced by
 the City. Oversized containers will not be collected.

It Was Left Behind Because ...

There is often a good reason why waste materials are not collected. Please remember that waste not set out according to the City's Waste Collection program will not be picked up.

COMMON REASONS FOR REFUSED COLLECTIONS:

- Bags/containers over the three-item garbage limit without a paid garbage tag
- Cardboard is not flattened and bundled
- Cardboard exceeds size limits
- Excessive contamination or non-recyclable materials in the blue box, green bin or leaf and yard waste container
- Leaf and yard waste container is unmarked and/or lid has not been removed

- Materials placed in oversized or improper containers
- Non-collectible waste
- Overflowing waste containers
- Overweight item
- Set in a snowbank

COMMON REASONS FOR MISSED COLLECTIONS:

- Items not out by 7 a.m.
- Items hidden, inaccessible or set in a snowbank
- Items placed too far back from the curb
- Materials not scheduled for collection that day/week

How to Dispose of ...

York Region

HOUSEHOLD HAZARDOUS WASTE (HHW)

Anything in your home that is labelled poisonous, corrosive, explosive or flammable must be disposed of safely. Vaughan residents can drop off hazardous waste free of charge at the York Region HHW Vaughan Depot, 2840 Rutherford Rd.

ELECTRONIC WASTE (E-WASTE)

Electronic items should not be thrown in the garbage as they may contain hazardous materials.

Here are some examples:

- Computers, monitors, printers
- Stereos, VCR/DVD players, radios
- Telephones, cellphones, pagers, answering machines
- Cameras and video projectors
- Electronic thermostats without mercury

Disassembled electronics will not be accepted.

Large appliance and metal items are collected by appointment only.

A fee applies for the municipal collection of large appliances.

LARGE METAL RECOVERY COLLECTION

Consider alternative disposal options:

- If your appliance is in good working order, consider donating it to a charity or family in need
- Take your appliance to a York Region Community Environmental Centre (fees may apply)
- Contact a private scrap metal dealer
- Contact the Ontario Power Authority (OPA) at saveonenergy.ca for information on its free fridge and freezer pickup program

Fridge, stove, dishwasher, freezer, dryer, barbeque (tank removed), washer, water heater, furnace, dehumidifier, metal water softener (sand removed), metal bathtub, pool heater, etc.

During Winter Months ...

Waste materials should not be placed on roads or behind/on top of snowbanks. Collectible materials should be placed on the right side of your driveway approximately 0.9 metres (three feet) from the curbside.

The right side of the driveway is defined as the right side when standing at the curb facing the house. These tips will reduce the chance of waste materials being damaged and/or buried by snow during snowplowing operations.

Safe Disposal of Fat, Oil and Grease

How you dispose of fat, oil and grease can have a serious impact on your home and the environment. When poured down the sink, drain or toilet, they can clog sewer pipes.



Fats, oils and grease are byproducts of cooking.

These include:

- Butter and margarine
- Shortening and lard
- Salad dressings
- Cooking oils (including deep frying oils)
- Sauces and gravies

SAFE DISPOSAL

- Fat, oils and grease are organic waste that should be placed in your green bin
- Before washing cooking equipment and dirty dishes, wait for fats, oils and grease to harden, then wipe with a paper towel or scrape it into the green bin
- If fats, oils and grease are in liquid form, leave them to cool and then empty into the green bin
- Liquid cooking oil that won't solidify can be dropped off at one of York Region's waste depots for recycling into biodiesel


