

Project Overview

The Islington Avenue Streetscape Phase 1 is located on Islington Avenue between Major Mackenzie Drive and Pennon Road.


The project creates a village gateway and "natural landscaped streetscape area" within the Kleinburg-Nashville Heritage Conservation District.



Project Overview

The streetscape and gateway design aims to:

- enhance and reinforce Kleinburg's rich built, natural and cultural heritage,
- be functional in today's demanding environment,
- be ecologically and economically viable, capture the non-formal landscape characteristics of country roadsides, and
- highlight the importance of Art in this community.
- Streetscape Design for Phase One includes planting, the gateway element, seating areas and recommendations for pavement improvements (Lighting, public art and bike lanes are not included).

- Provide a project status update and overview of work completed to date;

Overview of Work Completed to Date

- Reviewed relevant previous studies including the Islington Avenue Streetscape Masterplan;
- Cultural Heritage conservation analysis completed;
- Site was mapped out in an official base survey;
- Inventory and analysis completed of existing site conditions including utilities and fences;
- Site opportunities and constraints were delineated;
- Public input was obtained through Public-Stakeholder Consultation at Public Meeting 1;
- Conceptual and schematic design plans were developed including character area zone and character area collages, plan, section and elevation renderings were drawn;
- Site furnishings and plant species were considered in a component matrix and plant palette;
- Construction drawing set started for tender.




Overall Landscape Concept Schematic Plan
















Node Enlargement #2






Node Enlargement #3
