





HOW DO WE EVALUATE THE SUCCESS OF THE NHN IN ACHVIEING THE GOAL?





Forest Interior








Wetland Critical Function Zone









CRITERIA TO EVALUATE THE NHN

Ecological Linkage








OTHER PUBLIC ISSUES & CONCERNS IN REGARD TO EVALUATING THE NHN

- creating trails that allow public access for passive recreation and active lifestyles
- restoring areas of woodland and removing invasive species such as buckthorn
- managing Emerald Ash Borer (insect attacking Ash trees)
- managing potential risks to the public such as hazardous trees
- managing wildlife in the City such as coyote, raccoon, skunk, etc.
